Lucinda Williams, 'Good Souls Better Angels'

One of America's greatest living songwriters, Lucinda Williams dissects political, societal, and personal dysfunction on this focused, rock-forward record. Setting aside the blues detours of past efforts, she turns up the amps and gets down to business, eviscerating a now-loser president on "Man Without a Soul," taking 2020 to task in "Bad News Blues," and threatening a perennial "thorn in my side" in the ferocious "Bone of Contention." The performances are all vibrant and intense — a cover of Greg Garing's "Down Past the Bottom" is simply terrifying — putting Williams' famously breathy

voice right in your ear. She reunited with co-producer Ray Kennedy for the first time since the 1998 watershed *Car Wheels on a Gravel Road*. It was worth the wait. —*J.H.*
